Interview with Marialaura Corrente, President in charge of EALVD



Dear Marialaura, In September 2021 you were appointed as the President of EALVD. What are your first impressions?

I have mixed feelings about this appointment. I am the first EAVLD President after the beginning of the coronavirus pandemic, which has been an earthquake whose dramatic consequences we are still trying to manage. But, being an optimist, I feel confident that several actions can improve the situation and the newly renewed and enlarged EALVD Board can play a part in this process. We met online on the 29th of November for a kick-off meeting and we set up a series of promising activities for the EAVLD.

What about the EAVLD virtual meeting, do you think it was effective?

As the congress in Seville was postponed to 2022, the past President Eefke Weesendorf and other Board members agreed to organise a virtual meeting. Jose Luis Blanco, professor of the Complutense University of Madrid, and the Committee did an excellent work for the organisation of the meeting. On Last October, up to 130 researchers, attended the intensive sessions of lectures and presentations, proving the success of the event. We met virtually in Spain but we are planning to have a Congress in Seville, next year. There will be awards and bursaries for PhD students and young researchers, to allow them to participate.

What will EALVD do for laboratory veterinarians in the future?

Vets and laboratory veterinarians have played crucial roles during pandemic, demonstrating the importance of the One Health approach not only in controlling infectious diseases but also in food safety testing .

In that perspective we should pursue and adapt to our times , the mission of the association, as mentioned in our Statute:

"EAVLD is a non profit making, independent association with the mission of improving veterinary and public health by providing a platform for communication among veterinary laboratory diagnosticians" Moreover, I think the EAVLD should promote policies of inclusion and gender equality .















What do you expect from your new position? Will you be able to manage this activity with your academic commitments?

I am sure the EALVD experience will be very important for me. My expertise both as a researcher and teacher will be surely enriched. During the pandemic, it has been extremely hard and frustrating to manage online teaching and to keep students engaged. By making meaningful international connections, I expect to develop news skills.

What would you recommend to the new Board Members and to EALVD Members?

My dream is to receive as more requests and inputs as possible, from all Members and in particular from young researchers, in order to share ideas with them. In other words I would like to coordinate a very interactive group of researchers. So, please, EALVD member: connect, share, get in touch!




In October 2018 we met in the city of Brussels to celebrate the 5th EAVLD Congress. There, we scheduled to celebrate a new meeting two years later in the Spanish city of Seville.

Little could we imagine then the pandemic situation that we are going through since February 2020, and which has forced the 6th Congress to be cancelled for two consecutive years. I think all of us have suffered the loss of a family member, friend or colleague due to COVID19. There have been many casualties, too many. But their memory will remain in our hearts, will drive us every day to continue working because that is precisely what each of them would have wanted us to do. We owe it to them and to their memory.

We hope to meet you again, in person, in October 2022 in the beautiful city of Seville (Spain). However, as both the EAVLD Board and the Organizing Committee of the 6th Congress considered that it was a long period without being in contact with our associates, we decided to organize a virtual meeting on November 17 2021.

The schedule for such a virtual meeting was quite intensive. **The conference was attended by about 130 researchers**. Initially, we attended an emotional welcome from our President, Dr. Marialaura Corrente, who recalled the dramatic consequences of COVID19 in her home country, Italy, and throughout Europe and the rest of the World. She also recalled, together with Dr. Sergio Alvarez-Perez, the challenges faced by veterinary laboratory diagnosticians, whose work is becoming more important in this globalized world where the emergence of new threatening diseases is likely to occur.



















EALVD 2021: CONFERENCE REPORT

Continuing with the schedule of the Meeting, we attended three excellent conferences. **Dr. Lucia Biffar** presented the latest news regarding the development of new vaccination strategies against bovine tuberculosis. In a world concerned about the appearance of new pathogens, we cannot forget those pathogens that have been among us for so many years and that continue to be a primary objective of our efforts to attempt their eradication, or at least, to minimize their prevalence.

Next, **Dr. Wim van der Poel** spoke about the zoonotic aspects of SARS-Cov-2 from a global perspective, covering both what it is currently known about the virus and the different theories about its origin, with a description of the disturbing scenario created by the possible appearance of new pandemics. As Dr. Van der Poel highlighted, surveillance networks in animal medicine are essential to stop or, at least, minimize the impact of COVID19 and other new pandemics. And it is precisely here where veterinary laboratory diagnosticians will play a fundamental role, of high health interest.

Finally, **Dr. Antonio Martinez Murcia** detailed the different genetic procedures that are being used to reach a deep understanding of the different genetic variants of SARS-Cov-2, and, what is more important, the possibilities that new variants of the virus arise in the future. In this regard, genetic analyses are essential to control and anticipate possible changes in the virus that may lead to an increased pathogenicity.

After these three conferences, an interesting discussion was established, with questions from the attendees to the keynote speakers, who clarified concepts and dispelled doubts.

Then we had a session of **Oral Communications**. The Scientific Committee had the arduous previous work of selecting only 11 Communications from all abstract submissions. All of them had a high scientific quality and hence the difficulty of choosing, due to time constraints.

The presenting authors, most of them early-career scientists, talked about very diverse topics, all of them of great interest. Antimicrobial resistance, epidemiological surveillance of pathogens, and procedures for rapid and effective detection of new diseases were some of the topics discussed.

















EALVD 2021: CONFERENCE REPORT

At this point the morning was already well advanced, and it only remained to put a closure at the height of the Meeting celebrated. Dr. Tomás Mayoral, on behalf of the Organizing Committee, made a summary of what we had seen in the Conference, highlighting the three lectures given. Dr. Mieke Steensels, on behalf of the EAVLD, proceeded to the official closing of the Conference, summoning the EAVLD partner assistants to join the General Assembly of the organization, to vote for the entry of new members in the Board and to discuss about the activities of the Association.

The link to all the contents of the conference will be available to registered attendees until January 17, 2022 by using the link and password previously used to attend the Meeting. Later on, we will post such contents on the EAVLD's website.

Finally, during the Virtual Meeting, Dr. Jose L. Blanco made a brief presentation of the Face-to-face Congress to be held in Seville in October 2022.

As Dr. Blanco said, **in Seville, we hope to meet all of you in person**, and we will add to the excellent scientific quality of the event, which is traditional in every EAVLD Congress, the typical warmth of the welcoming Spanish, Andalusian character, and, let's not forget, the charm of the city of Sevilla. The organizing committee is preparing an interesting scientific congress that will include recreational activities to facilitate greater personal contact between the attendees.

You can follow everything related to the next face-to-face Congress on its website, eavld 2022.org. At present, we are still working hard to prepare what we hope you consider to be an excellent Scientific Program, with a series of conferences that will not forget to address COVID19 and its impact on animal health, with special attention to its diagnosis, which the main objective of our association. Once the final program for the upcoming meeting will be available, we will update all the data on its website.



The **Memorandum of the Understanding, discussed by ECVM, EALVD and ESGVM during** the first congress of the European College of Veterinary Microbiology (ECVM), held in Athens, at the end of September 2019 **has been drafted, finalized and signed.** In summary, the MoU describes the common interests of the three associations and the objectives of their collaboration:

Objectives of MoU:

- 1) Standardization of methods and procedures used by veterinary diagnostic laboratories
- 2) Standardize evidence-based antimicrobial therapy, antimicrobial stewardship and best infection control practices in veterinary medicine
- 3) Contribute to the training of ECVM-certified specialists
- 4) Raise awareness about the importance of controlling the emergence of drug-resistant microorganisms using a One Health intersectoral approach
- 5) Implement One Health research and training collaborations and profiency testing between human and veterinary clinical microbiologists and infectious disease specialists
- 6) Co-organization of conferences for veterinary microbiological diagnosticians as a platform for communication, networking and scientific update

Representatives of these organizations will hold the next meeting in the beginning of 2022, during which they will discuss the possibilities of courses, training and conferences for members of the ECVM, EAVLD or ESGVM. The outcome of this meeting will be addressed in the next newsletter.


