## EALVD 2022: CONFERENCE REPORT

Last October 24, more than 250 people gathered in the city of Seville to celebrate the 6th Congress of the European Association of Veterinary Laboratory Diagnosticians, in an excellent venue such as the Hotel Renacimiento and its functional facilities, prepared to host our Congress.

This Congress should have taken place in October 2020, but we have all lived through the sad moments that have forced its delay until this year 2022. All those who have left us will always be in our memory, and their memory pushes us to continue working every day with more intensity.

We would like to start this brief summary with our acknowledgement to the companies that support the meeting. Punctually, at 8:30 on the 24th, the opening ceremony took place, chaired by the Rector of the Complutense University, Dr. Joaquín Goyache, accompanied by the President of the EAVLD, Dr. Marialaura Corrente, and the President of AVEDILA, Dr. José Luis Blanco. The three of them gave a warm welcome to all the attendees, remarking the joy of being able to meet personally after the bad times experienced. And that punctuality was a constant throughout the congress, where all the sessions were developed as planned, with great participation of the attendees and great scientific interest in all of them.

Eight plenary conferences were held. **Dr. Gudrun Overesch** presented very interesting data on the situation of the problem of antimicrobial resistance in Europe, with updated and worrying data. **Dr. Joaquín Goyache** shared data from his laboratory regarding the presence of SARS-COV 2 in our pets, especially worrying in the case of cats. **Dr. Nick Johnson** concerned us with the possible new pathogens that may arrive, alerting us to the control mechanisms that we must establish. **Ms. Elisa Gredilla** commented on a topic of great importance such as everything related to the legislation on ISO accreditations and the importance it has on the development of laboratory diagnostic procedures. **Dr. Antonio Martinez-Murcia** talked about the new molecular diagnostic methodologies, with special attention to the threat that is looming over Europe with the African Swine Fever. **Dr. Laura Lechuga** introduced us to the incredible world of nanotechnology and its applications in laboratory diagnostics, something that has gone from science fiction to reality in just a few years.

**Dr. Beatriz Romero** explained the recent advances in the diagnosis and control of tuberculosis, an everpresent threat. Finally, **Dr. Elena Bozzetta** spoke to us about a field that is rarely dealt with in our congresses, the detection of anabolic agents, opening up our spectrum of action.

Likewise, **8 Sessions were held with a total of 48 oral communications**, all of them of a high scientific level. In addition, **90 posters** on various topics were exhibited in the poster room throughout the Congress.

Special mention should be made of the session for PhD Students, which was coordinated by the DVM Kiki Streng, and PhD student. Not only was it a session with four interesting communications, but also a survey was conducted during and after the Congress to find out the concerns of young researchers and what they ask from an association like the EAVLD and its periodic congresses. We are sure that the analysis of this survey will be of great benefit to the EAVLD in the near future.

# EAVLD2022 PhD Session report SURVEY by Kiki Streng, PhD candidate, Wageningen University & Research – The Netherlands

As EAVLD and AVEDILA are aware that the future of their associations is relying upon young researchers, new talents and new ideas; a dedicated PhD session was held for the first time during the EAVLD congress in Seville, Spain. During this session, four PhD candidates were given the chance to talk about their PhD project, or a specific study within their project. In this way, EAVLD and AVEDILA wanted to create an accessible platform for young researchers to highlight their project and present this to the EAVLD audience.

Each PhD candidate was given the opportunity to answer questions from the audience, as well as enlighten the audience with advices they would give upcoming PhD candidates or supervisors based on their own experiences.

Biel Garcias from the Veterinary Faculty of the Universitat Autonoma de Barcelona (Spain) started the session with the project "A case control study of prevalence enteric pathogens in catalonian farms with post weaning diarrhea". Bijan Godarzi from the Veterinary Faculty of Utrecht University (the Netherlands) continued the session with a talk about the development of a lateral flow micro array to detect WNV and USUV specific antibodies in humans, horses and blackbirds. Michela Maria Dimuccio from the University of Bari Aldo Moro, Valenzano (Italy) continued with a talk on the effect of rearing systems on rabbit welfare based on plasma cortisol and IL-6 detection. Last but not least, Gaia Casalino, from the same university as Michela, talked about campylobacter infections in laying hens in different rearing systems.

According to the post-congress survey, the PhD session was very well attended and participants were very satisfied with the session.

Hopefully, the PhD session can be implemented in future EAVLD events to give researchers of the future a platform to share their research!






#### **EAVLD Post Congress Survey**


SURVEY by Kiki Streng, PhD candidate, Wageningen University & Research – The Netherlands


#### Can you indicate the sector you are working in?





- 13 large companies




Satisfaction of participants with regards to the congress (score: from 1, very unsatisfied, to 5 very satisfied) How satisfied were you with topics addressed during the congress




How satisfied were you with the overall organization of the congress?



Jason moved to the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA) in 2000. His work at APHA has involved evaluating and introducing new laboratory diagnostic technology, working towards ensuring the APHA is using up-to-date and modern testing methods.

More recently, he has been involved with bovine TB vaccine and diagnostic research and is currently the workgroup leader for the Bovine TB research group in the Department of Bacteriology at APHA Weybridge. He is the named expert for the APHA WOAH reference lab for mammalian tuberculosis.

Jason lectures in veterinary diagnostic methods at the Royal Veterinary College and also carries out assessments of diagnostic test validation data as part of the test validation team at APHA which grants approval to tests prior to adoption as official UK veterinary laboratory tests.


